1. Project Goals

- Transform the General Psychology classes so that students have the available resources to succeed in higher education.
- Provide a no-cost textbook option to students taking General Psychology.
- Provide a scholarly resource that adheres to American Psychological Association standards and is adaptable for clarity.
- Implement a course redesign that utilizes the Brightspace D2L interface as the textbook resource center for students.
- Evaluate the impact of providing free resources on student success.

1.1 Statement of Problem

East Georgia State College touts itself as being a small access institution, promising students a better life. This is a bold promise considering that our students are failing to obtain the most fundamental keys to their success—textbooks. Of the 13 counties that are serviced by EGSC-Statesboro, Bulloch County has the highest percentage of the population below the poverty line at 31%. Of the 1591 who matriculated for fall 2014, 68% were financial aid recipients. Our students cannot succeed without the proper resources, and the financial burden imposed by high cost textbooks may be the death knell of their success. Psychology students are expected to understand technical information, and many simply are not capable of relying on classroom lectures alone. It is imperative that they have affordable resources available to supplement the lectures. Reportedly, 265 students are enrolled in General Psychology for fall 2014, which requires a textbook. To date, the EGSC bookstore (the only place they can purchase the textbook) has sold 93 copies to those currently enrolled. Approximately 172 (64%) of our General Psychology students are without a textbook. Providing our students with a no-cost-textbook option would provide that 64% with an opportunity to travel along a palpable road to academic success.

1.2 Transformation Action Plan

Action Steps:

- Evaluate the NOBA Project to serve as a scholarly resource to replace the current textbook.
- Review the prospective resource for depth, clarity, and accuracy.
- Adapt the selected resource to incorporate the established QEP for EGSC.
- Implement a syllabus redesign to accommodate the organization of the new resource.
- Make the resource available through the student's Brightspace online course component.
- Adapt the new resource to address APA standards and to facilitate student understanding of course content.
- Modify all presentations in accordance with the new parameters imposed by the No-cost textbook.
- Data Analysis: **Quantitative Measures** (a. within groups t-test of pre/post assessment data; b. multiple linear regression of explanatory variables on course average; c. comparison of general success rates to previous semester; d. simple descriptive statistics of pre/post survey data) **Qualitative Measures** (Item-level description of open-ended pre/post survey data)

The EGSC Textbook Transformation Team will review new developments on a continual basis to assure maintenance of the quality and currency of materials over the long-term. Student performance will continue to be monitored. We will join the OER Commons: Open Educational Resources Courses and Guides online group, to collaborate with other higher education professionals. Additionally, we will review each General Psychology chapter triennially to update and adapt our existing resources. These newly updated chapters will be designated by edition. Given the time necessary to update chapters, we will request a course release during the semesters that updates are made.
