Purpose and plan

In 2015, The PIs were funded with an ALG Textbook Transformation Grant and successfully developed a suit of no-cost-to-student course learning materials for ITEC 2110 (Digital Media). The materials have been made available to approximately 1,700 GGC students who take this course annually, which has resulted in significantly reduced costs to students. However, the technology used in Digital Media continues to advance like those used in other IT courses. In particular, the software we used in 2015 when designing our learning materials has evolved to new editions with new functionalities and new interfaces. Accordingly, some of the course learning materials designed in our previous ALG grant are largely obsolete. Therefore, our goals are to update these course materials to keep them up-to-date.
